DKIS Staff Participate in IB Professional Development Workshops

Dear DKIS Community,

At DKIS, we continue to prioritise professional growth for our educators so that we can offer the very best to our students. In August 2025, our staff participated in two International Baccalaureate professional development workshops hosted at our school, focusing on enhancing teaching practices and deepening conceptual understanding.

1. Building Teacher Competencies (Category 3, IB Continuum)

Led by Jane Hanna, this workshop guided teachers through multiple approaches to effective teaching, such as inquiry-based learning, conceptual and contextual teaching, and collaborative learning. The staff reflected on how to create equitable and inclusive classrooms, how to assess conceptual understanding, and how to become agents of change in their teaching practice. The sessions encouraged our team to refine their skills, connect theory to practice, and further develop as reflective practitioners.

2. Learning and Teaching for Conceptual Understanding (Category 2, PYP)

Facilitated by Lyneth Rozzuell Magsalin, this workshop focused on deepening understanding of concepts within the Primary Years Programme. The teachers explored how concepts shape curriculum design, enhance transdisciplinary learning, and promote student-driven inquiry. The sessions also highlighted strategies for designing meaningful learning experiences, assessing for conceptual understanding, and building collaborative learning communities.

Moving forward, you can expect these insights to be woven into our teaching approaches. With stronger competencies and a shared focus on conceptual learning, our classrooms will continue to grow as inclusive, engaging, and reflective learning spaces for all students.

We are excited about the positive impact these workshops will have on our school community and look forward to continuing our journey of growth as educators.

Payment for Additional Educational Services / School Tuition Fee

Dear Parents or Guardians,

The amount paid by parents of students in the international department for additional educational services has not changed since at least 2014. Until now, we have been able to provide all additional services within the funds you have contributed for your children's education. I would like to highlight the main factors influencing the increase in programme costs:

- From 2014 to 2025, inflation in Slovenia has totalled 30.1%. See: www.stat.si/inflacija - With the overhaul of the public sector pay system, salaries have increased and are already approximately 13% higher than last year. This percentage will increase further in October, when a new adjustment is scheduled.

To reiterate: the amount for additional services has remained unchanged for at least the past ten years.

Due to the above, I regret to inform you that starting from September 2025, the fee for the international programme's additional services will increase by 10%. Compared to the current fees, the new fees will be as follows:

Structured Timetable for the students enroled to the Afternoon Programme

The PYP Afternoon Programme operates on its own structured timetable. This means that students will participate in specific activities during the afternoon and **can be picked up only after the designated activity is completed**. This arrangement is designed to provide a more focused and immersive experience for your child.

The activities will start on 15 September.

Student Departure Procedures:

Leaving the school premises remains unchanged, and we kindly request your cooperation in following these guidelines:

Parent Sign-Out via Tablet: When you come to pick up your child, please use the tablet at the entrance to enter your child's student number. This helps us track student departures accurately. (Attachment 3)

Permanent Exit Ticket (PET): Students leaving the school premises at specified times (after lessons, after lunch, at 15.00, etc.) should use the Permanent Exit Ticket (PET) provided. This ensures a smooth departure process and helps us maintain security.

Student Pick-up by Older Sibling: If an older sibling (Grade 5 and up) is responsible for picking up a younger student, please inform the school in advance.

Scheduled Departure Time: If your child has a designated departure time, please either inform the AP teacher or the homeroom teacher via email or a paper note. This helps us ensure a seamless transition.

Important Information for Parents of Grade 3 and Above:

For parents of children in Grade 3 and above, we are introducing a new option for students to leave the school unaccompanied. If you wish your child to leave school alone at a specific time, kindly follow these steps:

Request for Permanent Exit Ticket: Please send an email to the school office (Ms Maya) or preferably to your child's homeroom teacher. In the email, specify the time slot you want your child to go home ALONE from school. You can choose the same time slot every day or specify a different one for each day.

We believe that these procedures will streamline the departure process and ensure the safety and well-being of all our students.

Instructions for student tablet paging system





- 1) On the homepage, touch the screen to show the keypad.
 - 1. Type in the student's code.
 - 2. While typing, the code will be written out in the field above the keypad.

An example of the code's structure:

For a student from **3. A**, born **06/12.** you type in the code **3A0612.** After the code is entered, you push the **OK** button, this is how you send a message to a teacher's pager.

In the event of an incorrect entry, you correct it by pressing the **DEL** button. **(4)** In the field below the keypad, the status of the call and the name and surname of the student will be written out.

The inscription **Accepted** means that the student has been notified and is on their way. Other inscriptions inform us about the student's location and that you will most likely have to wait.

If the entry information is correct and the entry is not accepted, the student is probably still in class and you should call later.

When the teacher responds, the reply will show itself at the top of the list, under the keypad.

All MYP students who play an instrument (or are eager to learn).





Dear Parents,


Badge for parents and employees at Danila Kumar International School.
