Based on the 4th paragraph of Article 51 of the Elementary School Act (Official Gazette of the Republic of Slovenia, No. 81/06, 102/07, 107/10, 87/11, 40/12-ZUJF, 63/13) and the 2nd paragraph of Article 5 of the Rules of Danila Kumar Elementary School on Adapting School Obligations (No.: 2485/2013, adopted on 03.06.2015; hereinafter referred to as the rules), the school and the parents hereby enter into the following

ADAPTATION OF SCHOOL OBLIGATIONS POLICY

The school, represented by the principal, the student: _____ and the parents, with this agreement, adapt school obligations and determine the mutual rights and obligations of the student with the status for the school year 2025/2026.

Benefits and Obligations:

- chooses the time for oral examination in a slot that allows for the acquisition of study material, or agrees independently with the teacher, on when they wish to orally respond to questions regarding the covered study material,
- the possibility for additional consultation with the teacher;

In a given evaluation period, a student may also remain ungraded. In this case, they will receive grades in the following evaluation period, specifically for the period when they were not graded and for the current period. The school, in collaboration with the student, parents/guardians, homeroom teacher, and the school counsellor, can create a more detailed plan for fulfilling obligations during instruction, which is an integral part of this agreement.

Upon written request from the parents, a student with the status can take a subject exam if they were not graded throughout the year due to excessive workload or if such grading was temporally impossible at the end of the year.

A student with the **status of a prospective athlete or artist** may be absent:

- From regular classes for a maximum of one pedagogical hour per day due to training or practice if it occurs concurrently with class.

A student with the **status of a top-tier artist** may be absent:

- From regular classes for several pedagogical hours per day due to practice if it occurs concurrently with class or for the entire school day in the case of scheduled preparations before a competition.
- The preparation plan must be submitted at the beginning of the school year or at least a month before the absence.

Absences from school due to a assigned status can only be excused based on written justifications from parents, clubs, associations, or the school, where the student receives additional education. Absences exceeding 5 school days require approval from the Head of the School.

The student or their parents are obliged to justify absences from school or other mandatory activities in accordance with the school rules.

A student with the status of a prospective athlete or artist, or a top-tier artist, must set an example in fulfilling school obligations. Adaptations only allow for additional absences and negotiations regarding knowledge assessment. The student is responsible for making up for missed lessons, tasks and assessments.

Methods and deadlines for assessing knowledge:

- A preselected/agreed-upon assessment date is binding for the student; in the case of unforeseen changes, the teacher should be informed at least three days before the selected date.
- If a student intentionally misses a scheduled assessment, their knowledge will be assessed during the next school hour when they are present at school.
- If it is not possible to assess whether a student meets all prescribed knowledge standards, they may take a subject exam after the end of the academic year.
- Due to competitions or performances the student participated in the previous day, they may excuse themselves to the teacher the following day before the start of the school day, a maximum of twice per subject within a single evaluation period.
- If a student does not adhere to agreements, their knowledge may also be assessed and graded without prior notice.

Student's Obligations:

- Diligently fulfils their school obligations: regularly completes homework, has study materials, actively participates in class, does not disrupt other students, and sets an example for classmates (due to competitions or performances, the student may provide prior notice to the teacher if they don't have homework).
- Takes responsibility for taking notes on missed study material.
- Must announce all absences from school in advance.
- Regularly informs their parents and coaches about their academic progress.
- In case of absences or increased participation in competitions and performances that prevent regular class preparation, the student must independently arrange for oral or written knowledge assessment and evaluation with teachers.
- In the event of a below-average performance in a particular subject, the student must regularly attend additional lessons at the teacher's suggestion.
- Is obliged to represent Danila Kumar Elementary School honourably in all school competitions, events, and meetings, except during preparation, competitions, or events at a higher level.
- Failure to adhere to obligations and agreements, as well as inappropriate behaviour, may result in the suspension of the student's status.
- If needed, the student should arrange additional help sessions with the teacher.

Parents' Obligations:

- Regularly monitor their child's academic performance and behaviour.
- Attend parent-teacher meetings with the class teacher and individual teachers regularly.
- In case of low grades, parents must collaborate with the teacher on improving and increasing them.
- Promptly and regularly report student absences.

Validity and Duration of the Agreement:

This agreement comes into effect on the date of signing by the parties and applies for the academic year 2025/2026 or until termination or revocation. A student's status can be revoked if the student receives negative assessments at the end of the evaluation periods; violates the school's rules and regulations or behaves inappropriately towards other students and school staff; or fails to fulfil the obligations stated in this agreement.

At the mid-year point, the class teacher verifies the validity of the conditions for obtaining the status (active athlete or artist).

In the event that a student with an assigned status violates the rules or fails to fulfil their duties, they will first receive a verbal warning, and in the case of subsequent violations, their status may be suspended or revoked.

During the suspension of an assigned status, the student will be unable to exercise the rights outlined in this agreement.
